## Instructions on Making a Travel Sewing Kit!





- Step 1 Print out your patterns, remember they are on 11 x 17 paper for the everything except for the straps.
- Step 2 Pick you your fabrics, I picked out two different fabrics, only because I used my Simple quilt squares. Your lining fabric can be a different color.
- Step 3 Cut out your pieces.
- Step 4 You will start sewing your pieces together by adding your pockets on each side of your contrast fabric. One side will have the 8" x 12" piece and the other will have the 6" x 15" on the other contrast piece. For the 6" piece, you will sew the bottom closed and place in the middle of your contrast piece. Do not forget to pleat your 6" pieces and you can also make your pieces longer if you want to have a larger envelop.





Step 5 I used 14" zippers to place on my sides, so that I could cut them down. Place your zippers on your main fabric and your contrast fabric. Do this on all four sides.

- Step 6 Sew your straps, turn them inside out and pin them to the top of your bag, sew the tops of your bag. Remember you do this to both sides.
- Step 7 We will now work on the zippered middle bag. First, sew your lining to the 8" pocket. Then you will add this to one of your contrast sides. If you want to do it to both sides, you can do this as well.



- Step 8 Add your 14" zipper to the top of your contrast fabric, also sew your lining as well to the top. Remember to trim your zipper, to fit into the 12" space.
- Step 9 Sew the sides of your middle bag. Press well and pin to one of your contrast pieces of your main bag. Sew to one of your contrast sides to hold in place at the bottom.
- Step 10 Sew the main fabric pieces together.
- Step 11 Carefully sew one side to a point and the other to a point of your contrast and middle bag. Pull through carefully and you will hand sew the opening at the bottom of the bag to close your seam.
- Step 12 Your bag is now finished, clip all threads! Press what you need and you are ready to use your bag.
